What is your personal relationship with water?

My relationship with water dates back a few years, when I was immersed in a terrible depression. In the midst of wanting to feel better, I began different therapies, and meditation began to show me images, all very surreal, where the sea, or more specifically water, appeared as a metaphor for pain, healing, chaos, calm, resurgence, admiration and contemplation.

Why did you decide to explore water in your paintings?

In order to understand what was inside the unconscious, how to represent that inexplicable feeling of emptiness, of fullness, of confusion and at the same time of illumination, because the sea is not only calm and chaos, it is depth and surface, opposing concepts within the same symbol.

What does water symbolise for you?

Both. For me water has a lot to do with emotions, but it doesn't only represent that, it becomes conceptual and explicit images about the understanding of emotions.

What does your creative process look like?

My creative process usually begins with introspection. I ask myself questions and ask others questions, and I conduct my research by writing everything down in my personal notebook, from my dreams to how I feel. Then I prepare my canvases and paint based on my own sketches and images, whether from photographs or directly from memories..

How do you translate movement, fluidity, or nature into painting?

I paint according to a specific emotion; in this way I can represent emotions and thus try to capture the natural movement of the landscapes.
